## *St. Peter's Seminary Hosts Special Tridentine Mass*



Last Saturday, April 5, St. Peter's Seminary in London, Ontario invited Fr. Peter Hrytsyk and members of the Assumption Church Tridentine Mass Community to make an afternoon presentation on the

Extraordinary Form Mass. St. Peter's Seminary prepares men for the priesthood from a number of Canadian dioceses, including the Diocese of London, which includes Windsor.

Fr. Peter spoke to the seminarians and faculty about the Classic Form. Of particular interest to the faculty was how his celebration of the Extraordinary Form influences his celebration of the Ordinary Form, a theme our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI raised in his accompanying letter to the *Motu Proprio*, *Summorum Pontificum*. As a bi-ritual priest, Fr. Hrytsyk was also asked to comment on the historical continuity between the Extraordinary Form and the Ukrainian Catholic Rite Divine Liturgy which he also celebrates.



A special Solemn Missa Cantata was held in the seminary chapel, to show the seminarians the Classic Form of the Mass. This was the first celebration of the Extraordinary Form in the chapel since the liturgical reforms of Vatican II.

The Assumption Tridentine Choir, along with altar servers from Assumption and St. Josaphat, provided the essential support for the Mass. The vigorous singing of the seminary community in conjunction

with the exquisitely clear sound of the chapel organ made for a powerful and memorable experience.

For many seminarians, this was their first exposure to the Classic Form of the Roman Rite. We applaud St. Peter's leaders for being the first seminary in our region to go beyond mere textbook teaching about the Tridentine Mass. In so doing, St. Peter's joins numerous other seminaries in North America who are taking a proactive stance towards our Holy Father's support of the Extraordinary Form.

The seminary graciously hosted a dinner after Mass for the volunteers who made the trip. Those present from St. Josaphat and Assumption considered it an honor to have been invited to introduce future priests to the Tridentine Mass.

## *Fr. Wolfgang Celebrates TLM on EWTN*



Last Sunday, April 6, at 8:00 AM Eastern time, our own Fr. Wolfgang Seitz made history of sorts by celebrating the third live Extraordinary Form Mass on EWTN. The first such Mass was celebrated by Fr. Josef Bisig, FSSP, and the second by Fr. Paul Berg, FSSP, thus making Fr. Wolfgang the first non-Fraternity celebrant to be granted this privilege.

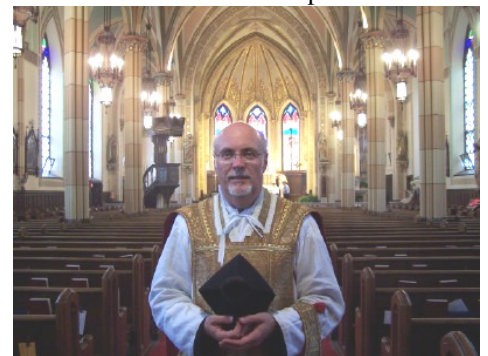
