Kaisar Marogi to Join Dominicans


The newly-designated St. Benedict Tridentine Community at Windsor's Assumption Church is pleased to announce its fourth vocation to the sacred priesthood: Longtime altar server Kaisar Marogi has entered the Dominican novitiate. Initially he will reside at their house of formation in Cincinnati, Ohio.



Kaisar follows in the footsteps of seminarians Brother John Tonkins of the Canons Regular of the New Jerusalem, Deacon Joe Tuskiewicz of Blessed John XXIII Seminary near Boston, and James Murphy of St. Peter's Seminary in London, Ontario. Two additional members of our altar serving team are also considering vocations. While this is certainly impressive as a percentage of a community of modest size, it is worth noting that Extraordinary Form communities worldwide are known for a high rate of vocations. We ask that you keep Kaisar and all of our seminarians in your prayers.

News Items of Interest

Some brief but noteworthy developments to report this week:



New York's St. Patrick's Cathedral has removed the freestanding altar which had been used since the 1980s for Mass facing the people. The high altar under the ciborium (metal surmounting structure) at the rear of the sanctuary is once again being used for Mass, albeit still facing the people. In making this change, St. Patrick's Cathedral is following the lead of London's Westminster Cathedral. which similarly restored use of its high altar for all

London's Westminster Abbey, not to be confused with the Catholic Westminster Cathedral, is one of the main churches of

Anglicanism. Its central chapel is the site of many a famous Anglican service, including the wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton in 2011. It is a "Royal Peculiar", a place of worship that falls directly under the jurisdiction of the British monarch. Westminster Abbey was originally built as a Roman Catholic church, before the Protestant Reformation. Recently it saw a temporary return to its roots: On Friday, July 19, a Catholic Requiem Mass in the Extraordinary Form was held in its Shrine of St. Edward the Confessor.

On August 4, **St. Mary Cathedral in Gaylord, Michigan** is commencing a weekly Sunday 3:00 PM Mass in the Extraordinary Form. It joins Marquette's St. Peter Cathedral and Lansing's St. Mary Cathedral as the third cathedral in Michigan to host a weekly Tridentine Mass.

The Florida Catholic newspaper of the Archdiocese of Miami published an article entitled, "Old form of Mass attracts new generation: Plenty of young adults attend weekly Mass in Extraordinary Form in Miami". It quotes Jennifer Donelson, a young music professor, Gregorian Chant Schola director, and organizer of Juventútem Miami, along with several others who articulate the timeless appeal of the Tridentine Mass. Adorers Needed for Rosary Chapel

The Rosary Chapel, located on the west side of Windsor's Assumption Church, is open for Eucharistic Adoration most days until 8:00 PM. There is a need for people to sign up for two-hour periods as adorers, as the Blessed Sacrament should not be left unattended, especially when exposed in a monstrance. As co-users of Assumption Church, members of the St. Benedict Tridentine Community are invited to sign up as adorers for specific time slots in the book at the back of Rosary Chapel.

The 2006 Manual of Indulgences grants a Plenary Indulgence to those who spent at least 30 minutes in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, under the usual conditions of Confession within 20 days, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom from attachment to sin. The Blessed Sacrament does not need to be exposed; one may gain this indulgence even if It is simply reserved in the tabernacle.
