Praying for the Holy Father's Intentions

A good habit to make in prayer, and one of the requirements for gaining a Plenary Indulgence, is to pray for the intentions of our Holy Father. Note that we are not praying for the person of the Pope, but for his intentions. We are not obliged to know what those intentions are when we are praying for them. Nevertheless, it is reasonable to ask, what exactly are those intentions?

For many years, this writer and others assumed that they were the monthly intentions which the Holy Father makes widely known through the Apostleship of Prayer (www.apostleshipofprayer.org). In their current form, there are two intentions per month, one Universal Intention, and one Evangelization Intention.

For the month of September, 2016, the Universal Intention is: For the Centrality of the Human Person:

That each may

contribute to the



common good and to the building of a society that places the human person at the center.

The <u>Evangelization Intention</u> is: **Mission to Evangelize:** That by participating in the Sacraments and meditating on Scripture, Christians may become more aware of their mission to evangelize.

During the pontificate of Pope Francis, some of these monthly intentions have seemed vague, secularist, or even not very Catholic. The Universal Intention for September is one such example.

An August 30 post on Fr. John Zuhlsdorf's blog, www.wdtprs.com, quite reasonably raised the question whether the faithful are obliged to pray for intentions which do not seem in concert with orthodox Catholic teaching. Two commenters responded with similar observations: We are free to pray for *General Intentions* of the Holy Father, rather than for the Apostleship of Prayer intentions. The first commenter stated:

"A commentary on Canon 984 in the 1917 CIC [the previously inforce Code of Canon Law] describes them [the General Intentions] thus:

'The general intention of the Holy Father is the exaltation of the Church, the propagation of the Faith, the uprooting of heresies and schisms, the conversion of sinners, and peace and concord among the nations."

The second commenter's remarks:

"Prümmer in his Manuále (vol. III, no. 556) says that 'Intentions of the Holy Father' which we pray for in the course of obtaining an Indulgence are a five-fold set which tradition (and the former Congregations) have fixed as such, namely:

- 1. Exaltátio S. Matris Ecclésiæ (The triumph/growth of holy mother the Church),
- 2. Extirpátio hærésum (The rooting out of heresy),
- 3. Propagátio fídei (The propagation of the Faith)
- 4. Convérsio peccatórum (The conversion of sinners),
- 5. Pax inter príncipes christiános (Peace among Christian rulers)."
- Fr. Z concurred with these comments, which seem eminently

reasonable and backed up by tradition. No Catholic should fear that praying for the Holy Father's intentions results in praying for anything

contradictory to the Church's immemorial needs and traditions. Keeping in mind the Holy Father's General Intentions is one option for praying for the Pope's intentions fully in concord with the mind of the Church.
