The Apostolate to Assist Dying Non-Catholics

Have you ever contemplated the plight of relatives and friends who will not become Catholic or refuse to resume the practice of their original Catholic faith? Although one can never presume against the mercy of God, there is a high likelihood that anyone who refuses to adopt the One True Faith will end up in hell for all eternity. How could anyone wish that fate on our loved ones?

There was an apostolate that addressed this very concern: The Apostolate to Assist Dying Non-Catholics was founded in the 1930s in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, Ohio by Msgr. Raphael Markham. He composed a prayer to be used at the deathbed that became a popular prayer card [below], translated into 25 languages and used around the world. Deathbed conversions were attributed to this "Prayer Card Apostolate", proving that one must never give up hope. A quirk of the Traditional Mass calendar is that Corpus Christi is celebrated both on its standard Thursday after Trinity Sunday, as well as on the subsequent Sunday as an External Solemnity. In the U.S. the latter is required; in Canada it is merely the custom. The below schedule includes the Thursday Masses. Next Sunday, June 23, there will be Eucharistic Processions after the 9:45 AM High Mass at the OCLMA/Academy of the Sacred Heart and the 2:00 PM High Mass at St. Alphonsus, Windsor.

A Plenary Indulgence is granted to the faithful who prayerfully take part in a Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession, under the usual conditions of Confession with 20 days, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom from attachment to sin.
