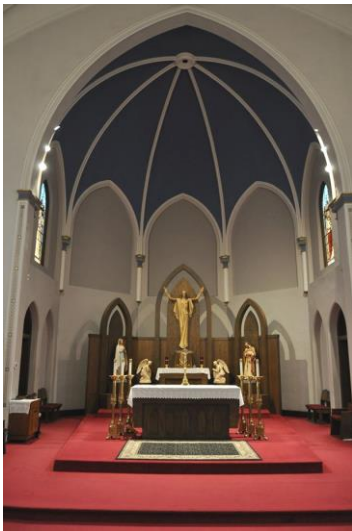

Un-Wreckovation of St. Wenceslaus, Wahoo, Nebraska

Few things warm the Catholic traditionalist's heart like seeing a formerly wreckovated historic church restored to its original appearance. That's exactly what's happening at St. Wencelaus Church in Wahoo, Nebraska. Atlanta-based church restoration firm King Richard's Liturgical Design was hired to replicate the original High Altar, Side Altar, Pulpit, and Communion Rail that had been removed in 1973. Pontifical Liturgical Books Back in Print

In our October 18, 2015 column, we explained that there are two principal liturgical books used by a bishop: The *Pontificale Romanum* (Roman Pontifical) and the *Canon Missæ ac Usum Episcoporum et Prælatorum* (Pontifical Canon). The former contains Sacraments and blessings particular to a bishop, such as Confirmation, while the latter is a large-font altar missal containing the Ordinary of the Mass as adapted for a bishop.

While the *Pontificale Romanum* was reprinted (in paperback form, strangely) by the Vatican in 2009, and hardcover editions remain widely available on the used market, the *Canon Missæ*, especially the 1962 edition that we should be using, has been exceptionally hard to source and very expensive on the rare occasions one is found. It turns out that a few years ago, the *Canon Missæ* was quietly republished by Germany's Nova et Vetera Publishing. A welcome development for the ever-increasing number of sites where bishops are celebrating the Traditional Mass.
