*Next Traditional Latin Mass
at Ste. Anne de Detroit on Saturday, February 15*



Historic Ste. Anne de Detroit Church will hold its next Tridentine Mass on Saturday, February 15 at 7:00 PM. The Mass will fulfill the Sunday obligation. It will be a Solemn High Votive Mass of Our Lady with Deacon and Subdeacon. The celebrant will be Fr. Ryan Adams, Associate Pastor of the parish. A parish choir under the direction of Joe Moss will provide the music. Altar servers from the Oakland County Latin Mass Association and the St. Benedict Tridentine Community will assist. Ste. Anne is Detroit's oldest parish and the sister to Windsor's Assumption Parish, each located on the opposite ends of the Ambassador Bridge.

Weekly Saturday Mass Now a High Mass in Redford

The weekly Saturday 8:00 AM Low Mass at St. Mary of Redford will become a High Mass on February 1st, thanks to the establishment of a volunteer schola to provide the music.

The parish is also holding a special Solemn High Mass for the Feast of the Purification next Sunday, February 2 at 6:00 PM. The traditional blessing of candles and procession will take place at the beginning of Mass.

The three-volume set in hardcover was reprinted by PCP Books and is available from a number of on-line booksellers at a price of \$150.

Tallying Use of the Holy Name in the OF vs. EF

A January 13, 2020 article on the New Liturgical Movement blog by Dr. Peter Kwasniewski compared how many times the Name of Our Lord is used on the Feast of the Holy Name in the Ordinary Form vs. the Extraordinary Form of the Mass. The tally? 27 mandatory times in the Traditional Mass, versus approximately 7 mentions in the Novus Ordo, depending on which options are chosen.
