

The Archdiocese of Detroit permitted public Masses to resume on May 19, with restrictions of 25% maximum capacity in a church, mandatory wearing of masks by the congregation, discouragement of congregational singing, and mandatory social distancing.

The Diocese of Lansing permitted public weekday Masses on May 18. At press time there is no word when public Masses will resume in the Diocese of London, Ontario.

Arctic Circle Monastery Embraces the TLM

Catholic World Report published the fascinating story of Marias Lamm (Mary's Lambs) a new, small community of nuns in a remote village north of the



Arctic Circle, Lannavaara, in Swedish Lapland. The nearest parish church is a four hour drive south. Based in a former school purchased by a donor for them, their Sankt Josefs Kloster (Monastery of St. Joseph) became a popular retreat site for Swedish priests, and in 2016 the sisters embraced the Traditional Mass. A Benedictine monk plans to take up residence with the sisters this month and will offer the Sacraments in the traditional form for them.
