## *Airport Chapel Visit Jubilee Year Indulgence*

Our May 3, 2015 column elaborated on the often-hidden Catholic chapels in airports. We must have been anticipating something grand, because the Vatican announced – and recently extended – the grant of a Plenary Indulgence to those who visit specifically designated Catholic airport chapels during the Jubilee Year of Loreto, which Pope Francis recently extended through December 10, 2021. The faithful who visit those airport chapels and pray the Our Father, the Creed, and the Jubilee Prayer (available at the chapels) or the Litany of Loreto before an icon, statue, or image of Our Lady of Loreto, may gain a Plenary Indulgence under the usual conditions of Confession within 20 days, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom from attachment to sin.

It is said that the Holy House of Loreto, where the Blessed Virgin Mary was born and raised, was transported by Angels from Nazareth first to Croatia in 1291 and then again to Loreto, Italy in 1294. In 1920, Pope Benedict XV proclaimed Our Lady of Loreto as the Patron Saint of air travelers and pilots, and the granting of the aforementioned Plenary Indulgence marks the centenary of that declaration.

Airport chapels were required to apply to the Vatican to be designated as one at which the Indulgence could be gained. In North America, the Chicago Midway and O'Hare, Toronto, and Miami airport chapels sought and were given the requisite approval.

The O'Hare Airport Chapel is located on the Mezzanine Level of Terminal 2, outside the security checkpoint. The Midway Airport Chapel [pictured] is located on the Mezzanine Level of Concourse C, inside the security checkpoint, above the food court.

## *Ann Arbor Taste of Tradition Mass Series*

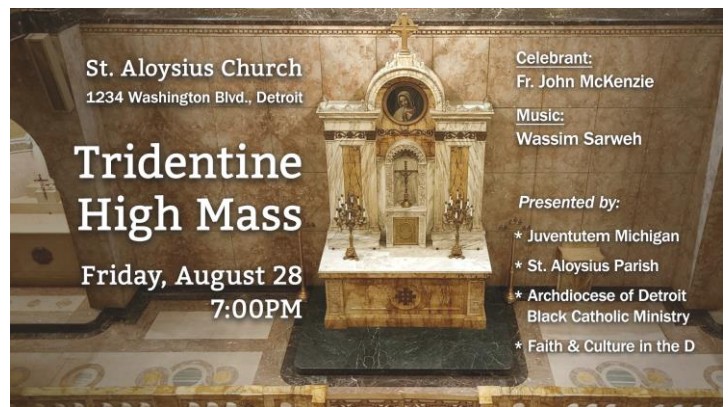
St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Ann Arbor continues its "Taste of Tradition" series, with 7:00 PM Latin Masses on the following dates:
