The Three Masses of All Souls Day to be Held At the OCLMA/Orchard Lake Shrine Chapel

For the first time in almost 50 years, the Side Altars at Orchard Lake Seminary's Shrine Chapel of St. John Paul II will be used for the celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass. On Monday, November 2, the Three Traditional Masses of All Souls will be offered: At 6:00 PM, two simultaneous Low Masses, using the Propers of the Second and Third Masses of All Souls, will be offered at the Side Altars. This is a rare opportunity to see Side Altars used for the purpose for which they were built, the celebration of Holy Mass.

At 7:00 PM, a Solemn High Mass with Deacon & Subdeacon will be celebrated at the High Altar. The sacred ministers will be Fr. Lukasz Iwanczuk, Fr. David Pellican, and Fr. Cy Whitaker, SJ.

You are invited to attend as many of these Masses as you are able, to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory on this, their Feast Day. Holy Communion will be distributed at all three Masses. The Church allows one to receive Communion up to twice in one day, as long as the second reception is at a Mass, which would be the case in this instance.

As you can see in the photo below, the left Side Altar, formerly dedicated to Our Lady, was recently upgraded with a new reredos and reliquary to reflect the chapel's designation as the Archdiocesan Shrine Chapel of St. John Paul II. The former pontiff visited Orchard Lake Seminary while still a Cardinal. The right Side Altar remains dedicated to St. Joseph.
