Traditional Latin Mass to Debut at Downtown Saginaw, Michigan's Holy Family Church on Sunday, December 13



No one in our part of the world has waited longer for the Tridentine Mass to be made available to them than our neighbors in the Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan. Struggling for years to get a single Mass site established under what can only, sadly, be described as an anti-tradition diocesan environment, things took a significant turn for the better with the appointment of Bishop Robert Gruss as the new Ordinary of the diocese.



Good things come to those who wait. On Sunday, December 13 at 3:00 PM, the first public Traditional Latin Mass in Saginaw in over 50 years will be held at the beautiful, historic Holy Family Church in downtown Saginaw. Masses will be held on an irregular schedule at first as logistics are ironed out, with the intent that the Mass becomes weekly in short order.

The celebrants for the new Latin Mass community will be Fr. Christopher Coman, Fr. Marcel Portelli, Fr. Thai Hung, and Fr. Nate Harburg. Fr. Coman will be the celebrant of the first Mass, at which Bishop Gruss will be present and will sit in choir.

The Oakland County Latin Mass Association, Old St. Mary's, and St. Matthew, Flint are providing personnel and assistance to make this long-awaited event come to fruition. Special thanks to Saginaw TLM organizer Joey Storer and Holy Family Pastor Fr. Prentice Tipton for persevering through challenging times to make this finally happen for the devoted faithful of their diocese.
