Next Traditional Mass at St. Anne de Detroit on April 9

Ryan Adams, and music will be provided by Ste. Anne music director Joe Moss and his choir. Altar servers from the Oakland County Latin Mass Association will assist. Both of the Archdiocese of Detroit's basilicas – the other being the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Little Flower in Royal Oak – have decided to add occasional Traditional Masses to their offerings, which is certainly in keeping with the mission of all basilicas to offer exemplary liturgy.

Holy Family's Traditional Mass has filled the church to allowable capacity, which has moved authorities to increase its

frequency to weekly, every Sunday at 3:00 PM, as of the First Sunday in Lent.
