



The Privately Owned St. Ann Church In Woonsocket, Rhode Island

Since publishing our March 28, 2021 column on privately owned historic Catholic churches, one more important example has come to our attention: St. Ann Church in Woonsocket, Rhode Island was purchased by a non-profit group after the Diocese of Providence closed it in 2000. The volunteers are dedicated to preserving the grand edifice's irreplaceable frescoes. Concerts and weddings of various denominations are held there, but there is no sign of Catholic Masses still being offered, sadly. The group does seem to be doing an admirable job of preserving the artwork, however. God willing, the building will one day once again host the immemorial liturgy for which it was built. 


New “Neumz” App Provides Comprehensive Recordings of Gregorian Chant

Catholic media has been aflutter with news of a project called “Neumz”, described as “The entire Gregorian chant repertory, recorded by the community of Benedictine nuns of the Abbey of Notre-Dame de Fidélité of Jouques, in French Provence.” Over 7,000 hours of chant have been recorded and are playable in an app for Android and iOS. There are different subscription tiers, the lowest being free, that allow an increasing amount of

selectability of the chant heard. The app provides the musical notation, Latin lyrics, and vernacular translation for each chant.

Because the project description refers to the “three year cycle”, this must be a collection of chants for the Ordinary Form, but nonetheless very interesting and relevant as a training resource.
