22nd Metro Detroit Sunday Tridentine Mass Site Debuts on May 2, 2021: Holy Family, Detroit



After several months of solid attendance for their Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 12:00 Noon Low Masses, Holy Family Church in Detroit will debut a monthly First Sunday Tridentine High Mass on <u>Sunday, May 2 at 9:30 AM</u>. This Mass will take the place of their longstanding Novus Ordo Latin Mass held at the same time. Pastor Fr. Paul Ward will be the celebrant. Volunteers from Our Lady of the Scapular Parish in Wyandotte are assisting with this effort. Holy Family thus becomes the *twenty-second* Sunday Tridentine Mass site in metro Detroit.

Notable Local Ornate Chalice & Pall

In recent weeks two unusually ornate liturgical objects were put to use:



For the Oakland County Latin Mass Association's Holy Thursday Mass at the Orchard Lake Shrine Chapel on April 1, 2021, Fr. Lukasz Iwanczuk used the chalice of Ss. Methodius Cyril & Seminary founder Father Józef Dabrowski. As the seminary was founded in 1885, originally located adjacent to St. Albertus Church in Detroit, the chalice likely dates from that era. A tall chalice, it is notable for the metallic angels which rise from the base. Fr. Lukasz elected to use this historic chalice because Holv Thursday commemorates the establishment of the Holy Priesthood.



On Friday, April 9, 2021 at the special High Mass at the Basilica of Ste. Anne de Detroit, Fr. Ryan Adams used an ornate chalice pall containing Ste. Anne's image. Unlike the vast majority of palls, which are flat, this particular pall has a rich, jeweled, three-dimensional design.

Kalamazoo Cathedral Restoration



A December 16, 2020 post at www.liturgicalartsjournal.com reported on the recently completed restoration of Kalamazoo, Michigan's St. Augustine Cathedral. A formerly fine church that underwent an unfortunate wreckovation in 1989 that destroyed their High Altar and Side Altars, St. Augustine's has been restored to an enhanced version of its original appearance by classical Catholic church architect Duncan Stroik. The High Altar (with new baldacchino), Side Altars, and a High Pulpit have been rebuilt. We must always remember that sacred though it is, a church is just a building, one that can be enhanced and beautified if we have the will and the funding. Thanks to Kalamazoo Bishop Paul Bradley for undertaking this initiative.
