

Cardinal Burke to Celebrate Pontifical Low Mass in Jackson, Michigan on May 26

Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke (born June 30, 1948) is an American Cardinal Prelate of the Roman Catholic Church. He serves as the Cardinal Patron of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, and his previous position was Cardinal Prefect of the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura, which he held until November 2014. Before being called to Rome to serve in the Apostolic Signatura, Cardinal Burke served as the Archbishop of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, Missouri (2003–2008) and as the Bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse, Wisconsin (1994–2003). He is the Cardinal-Priest of S. Agata de' Goti Church in Rome and holds the title of Archbishop Emeritus of the St. Louis Archdiocese. Cardinal Burke was ordained a priest on June 29, 1975 by Pope Paul VI and consecrated as a bishop on January 6, 1995, by Pope John Paul II. He was elevated to Cardinal on November 20, 2010 by Pope Benedict XVI. Along with Mr. Palazzolo, Cardinal Burke was one of the original signatories to the Collaboration Agreement signed between Padre Pio's Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza and Catholic Healthcare International on October 1, 2009.

Brentwood, California Celebrant Training Report



Deacon Candelario Jimenez Rosales will be ordained to the sacred priesthood for the Diocese of Oakland, California on Saturday, May 22. On Monday-Tuesday, May 3-4, he took training on celebrating the Traditional Latin Mass from Extraordinary Faith. One week after ordination, on Sunday, May 30 at 5:00 PM, he will celebrate his first TLM, a Solemn High Mass with Deacon and Subdeacon, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Brentwood. He looks forward to helping make the beauties of the Tridentine Mass available to the faithful in his diocese.

Fun fact: Knowing that Holy Mother Church grants a Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions, to the faithful who attend a newly ordained priest's first Mass (and only his very first Mass), Deacon Candelario wrote the Apostolic Penitentiary in Rome and received a special concession granting that Plenary Indulgence to those who attend his first four Masses. Who even knew that was a possibility?

Bronx, New York Priest Training Report



Congratulations to Fr. Roberto Perez, O. Carm., Prior of the Carmelites in the Bronx, New York, who celebrated his first Traditional Latin Mass on Thursday, May 13, after training from Extraordinary Faith. We also covered the Traditional Carmelite Rite, a variant on the Traditional Roman Rite. Fr. Perez intends to celebrate the Mass privately at first while improving his familiarity with the rubrics. He believes that beauty, particularly in the Sacred Liturgy, has a key role to play in evangelization, especially of Catholics who are hungering for something more than the typical suburban parish experience.
