41st Metro Detroit Tridentine Mass Site Debuts: Fatima Shrine, Riverview



One of metro Detroit's privately owned churches will hold its first Traditional Latin Mass on Friday, June 11 at 7:00 PM: The Fatima Shrine in Riverview. Owned by the Blue Army, the chapel became their home after selling their original location in Detroit. The chapel had been built for another denomination but has been painstakingly adapted for Catholic worship. All Masses are offered *ad oriéntem* at a High Altar, and Holy Communion is distributed at a rail. The chapel is one of the cleanest churches this writer has ever seen. Blue Army director Leonard St. Pierre has long wanted to bring the Traditional Mass to this ideal setting. Fr. Joe Tuskiewicz will be the celebrant, and altar servers and the choir from the Oakland County Latin Mass Association will assist at this special Mass. As is usually the case, if turnout is good for the first Mass, additional Masses may be scheduled in the future, so we encourage you to attend and show your support.

The Veni Creátor

One of the most important prayers in the Church's treasury is the *Veni Creátor*, a hymn to the Holy Ghost. The *Veni Creátor* is traditionally sung as the Offertory Hymn on January 1 and on the Feast of Pentecost. Its public recitation or singing on those days is enriched with a Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions. Praying it on other days is enriched with a Partial Indulgence.

Veni Creátor [Original Latin]

Veni, Creátor Spíritus, Mentes tuórum vísita, Imple supérna grátia, Quæ tu creásti péctora.

Qui dicéris Paráclitus, Altíssimi donum Dei, Fons vivus, ignis, cáritas, Et spiritális únctio.

Tu septifórmis múnere, Dígitus Patérnæ déxteræ, Tu rite promíssum Patris, Sermóne ditans gúttura.

Accénde lumen sénsibus, Infúnde amórem córdibus, Infírma nostri córporis Virtúte firmans pérpeti.

Hostem repéllas lóngius, Pacémque dones prótinus; Ductóre sic Te prævio, Vitémus omne nóxium.

Per Te sciámus da Patrem Noscámus atque Fílium, Teque utriúsque Spíritum, Credámus omni témpore.

Deo Patri sit glória, Et Fílio, qui a mórtuis Surréxit, ac Paráclito, In sæculórum sæcula. Amen.

Veni Creátor [1913 Blessed Sacrament Prayerbook translation]

Come, Holy Ghost, Creator, come, From Thy bright heavenly throne; Come, take possession of our souls, And make them all Thine own.

Thou Who art called the Paraclete, Best gift of God above; The living spring, the living fire, Sweet unction and true love.

Thou, Who art sevenfold in Thy grace, Finger of God's right hand, His promise, teaching little ones To speak and understand.

Oh! guide our minds with Thy blest light, With love our hearts inflame, And with Thy strength, which ne'er decays, Confirm our mortal frame.

Far from us drive our hellish foe, True peace unto us bring; And through all perils lead us safe Beneath Thy sacred wing.

Through Thee may we the Father know, Through Thee, the eternal Son, And Thee, the Spirit of them both – Thrice-blessed three in one.

All glory to the Father be, And to His risen Son, The like to Thee, great Paraclete, While endless ages run. Amen.
