Spokane Sacred Liturgy Conference Report

In a sign that the Catholic liturgical world is finally getting back to normal, the first large in-person convention post-Covid, the Sacred Liturgy Conference, took place in Spokane, Washington last Tuesday-Friday, June 1-4. Approximately 100 faithful from across the world — one-quarter the usual attendance, but still significant — gathered for talks and liturgies.



Notable events included an opening Mass celebrated by Spokane Bishop Thomas Daly in the Ordinary Form *ad oriéntem*, at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lourdes (above), accompanied by Latin chant.



Peripatetic promoter of the Dominican Rite, Fr. Gabriel Mosher, O.P., celebrated a Solemn High Requiem Mass in the Dominican Rite at St. Aloysius Church (above), concluding with Absolution at the Catafalque.

Archbishop Thomas Gullickson, the retired Apostolic Nuncio to Switzerland and Lichtenstein, who in recent years has become a proponent of the Traditional Latin Mass, celebrated an Extraordinary Form Pontifical Solemn Mass at the Throne for the Feast of Corpus Christi, concluding with a Eucharistic Procession around the grounds of Gonzaga University (below). In a talk the preceding day, His Excellency informed his audience that the Tridentine Mass is "the future of the Church."





Speakers included Mother Miriam of the Lamb of God, OSB (above), formerly known as Rosalind Moss, one of the regulars on the EWTN radio show, Catholic Answers; and Hillsdale College Latin scholar Dr. Patrick Owens. This writer made two presentations, one comparing the Ordinary Form, the Extraordinary Form, and the Dominican Rite of Mass.
