Educational Infographics on the Traditional Mass: Priestly Vesting

Various educational graphics from old books turn up from time to time on various web sites. Most need no explanation. For the next few weeks we will be featuring some that convey substantial information, the first set depicting the vesting of the priest.



The priest prays the traditional Vesting Prayers in Latin in the sacristy before Mass. Those prayers were presented in both Latin and English in the September 11, 2016 edition of this column, available at the address at the bottom of this page. There is a prayer for each item he puts on, as each is symbolic of an aspect of the priesthood. The maniple, for example, is a sign of service, much like a napkin carried over the left arm of a waiter in a formal restaurant. The amice is a shield against the devil, and the cincture is a sign of purity. There is a specific order to applying all of these pieces. One will never see something out of order, such as the stole on the outside of the chasuble, at the Traditional Mass. Sometimes out of necessity an item may be omitted, for example if there is no clean amice at hand, or if a particular vestment set lacks a maniple. Such omissions are not intentional and only temporary.
