Educational Infographics for the Traditional Mass: The Hours of the Divine Office

The Traditional Roman Breviary is comprised of eight offices or sets of prayers to be prayed during a day: Matins, Lauds, Prime, Terce, Sext, None, Vespers, and Compline. Note that “Nocturns”, despite being listed separately on the below graphic, are actually a part of Matins.

Perhaps in part motivated by the well-known phrase from Psalm 118 cited in the above graphic, “Seven times a day I praise Thee”, the Novus Ordo Liturgy of the Hours contains only seven offices, as the Office of Prime was suppressed. The Office of Matins was also renamed the Office of Readings.

Windsor Covid Restrictions Eased

The Diocese of London, Ontario has lifted many of the restrictions that have been imposed upon its parishes, including the St. Benedict Tridentine Community, since the beginning of the pandemic. Holy Communion on the tongue is once again permitted. Pre-registration for Sunday Masses is no longer required. Complex seating rules are no longer in force. Masking is still required as of the time of this writing, however.

Beginning April 1, a negative Covid test will no longer be required before crossing into Canada. This has not been required for entry into the United States via land borders. Only proof of vaccination will be required on both sides, plus entry of personal information into the ArriveCAN mobile app before crossing into Canada. This will hopefully lead to a resumption of Canadians and Americans visiting each other’s Latin Mass communities.

OCLMA to Offer Triduum at Orchard Lake Shrine Chapel

The Oakland County Latin Mass Association will once again offer the Sacred Liturgies of the Triduum in the Extraordinary Form at the Orchard Lake Shrine Chapel. Holy Thursday, April 14, will be at 7:00 PM. Good Friday, April 15 will be at 1:30 PM. The Easter Vigil, April 16, will be at 8:00 PM. The celebrant will be Fr. Lukasz Iwanczuk, Director of Spirituality at Orchard Lake Seminary.

There will be no Latin Mass at Orchard Lake on Easter Sunday, April 17. Sunday Masses will resume as usual the following Sunday, April 24 at 9:00 AM.
