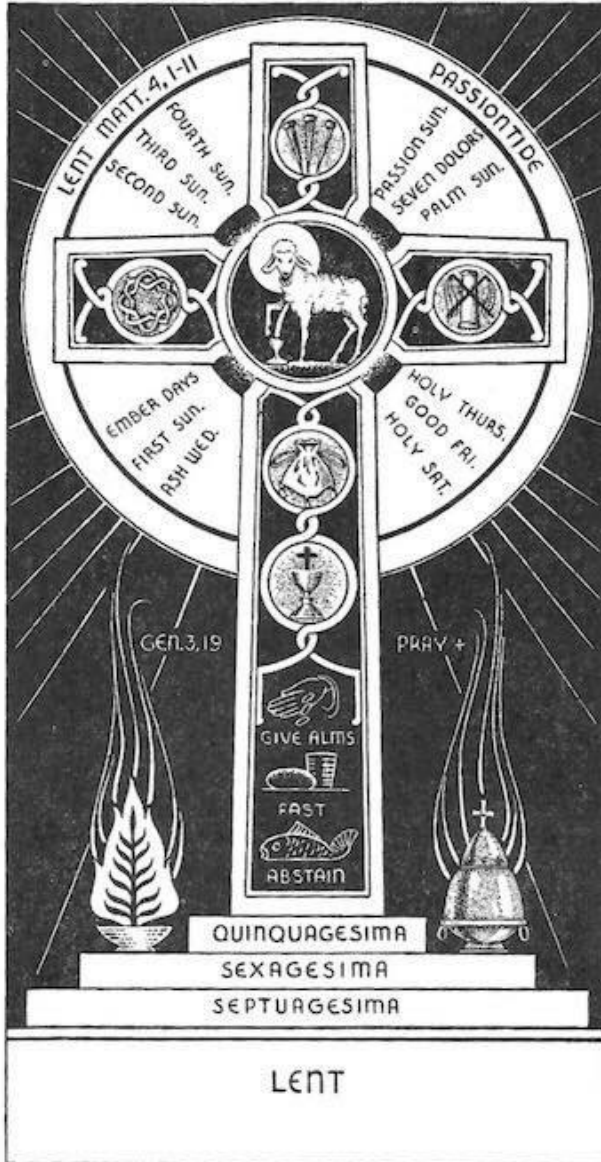

## *A Holy Week Schedule from 1939 London*

The August 5, 2018 edition of this column contained an historical schedule of services at London, England's Westminster Cathedral. It was breathtaking in its depiction of the number of events that took place each week. In fairness, even today Westminster Cathedral hosts a dizzying number of Masses each day. It is also the only church in the world which hosts a full choral (Ordinary Form) Mass featuring Latin polyphony and Gregorian Chant every day of the year.

Another historic schedule from that church has surfaced, this time from 1939 Holy Week. A marvelous example of the rich liturgical life that cathedrals can and should offer.

### Westminster Cathedral

#### HOLY WEEK, 1939

**PALM SUNDAY, APRIL 2nd.**

10.0 a.m.—Blessing and Distribution of the Palms by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP, followed by Procession and High Mass, in which The Passion according to St. Matthew will be sung.

12.30 p.m.—Low Mass (without Sermon).

**TUESDAY, APRIL 4th.**

10.30 a.m.—High Mass and Singing of The Passion according to St. Mark.

**WEDNESDAY, APRIL 5th.**

10.30 a.m.—High Mass and Singing of The Passion according to St. Luke. Vespers.

5.15 p.m.—Compline.

5.30 p.m.—Tenebrae.

**MAUNDY THURSDAY, APRIL 6th.**

Holy Communion every half-hour from 6.30 to 8.30 a.m.

8.45 a.m.—None, at which His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP will preside.

9.0 a.m.—Pontifical High Mass and Consecration of the Holy Oils by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

3.0 p.m.—Mandatum, or Washing of the Feet, by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

5.15 p.m.—Compline.

5.30 p.m.—Tenebrae, followed by the Ceremonial Washing of the High Altar.

**GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 7th.**

10.30 a.m.—Mass of the Pre-sanctified, by His Lordship the BISHOP OF AELIAE, in presence of His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

3.0 p.m.—The Stations of the Cross. Sermon by the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Canon M. HOWLETT, D.D., Ph.D.

5.15 p.m.—Compline.

5.30 p.m.—Tenebrae, at which His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP will preside.

8.15 p.m.—Stations of the Cross and Veneration of the Relic of the True Cross.

**HOLY SATURDAY, APRIL 8th.**

9.0 a.m.—Blessing of the Fire, Paschal Candle and Baptismal Font, by His Lordship the BISHOP OF LAMUS.

11.0 a.m.—Pontifical High Mass and Vespers in the presence of His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

5.15 p.m.—Compline.

5.30 p.m.—Pontifical Matins and Lauds of Easter Day, sung by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

**EASTER SUNDAY, APRIL 9th.**

10.0 a.m.—Pontifical Terce.

10.30 a.m.—Pontifical High Mass sung by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP, after which His Eminence will impart the Papal Blessing and Plenary Indulgence.

12.0 noon.—Low Mass. Sermon by the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Canon M. HOWLETT, D.D., Ph.D.

3.15 p.m.—Pontifical Vespers and Benediction sung by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

7.0 p.m.—Compline. Sermon by His Eminence The CARDINAL ARCHBISHOP.

**Sun. 04/03 2:00 PM:** High Mass at *Holy Name of Mary, Windsor* (Passion Sunday) – Covid testing requirement lifted at the Canadian border as of April 1.
