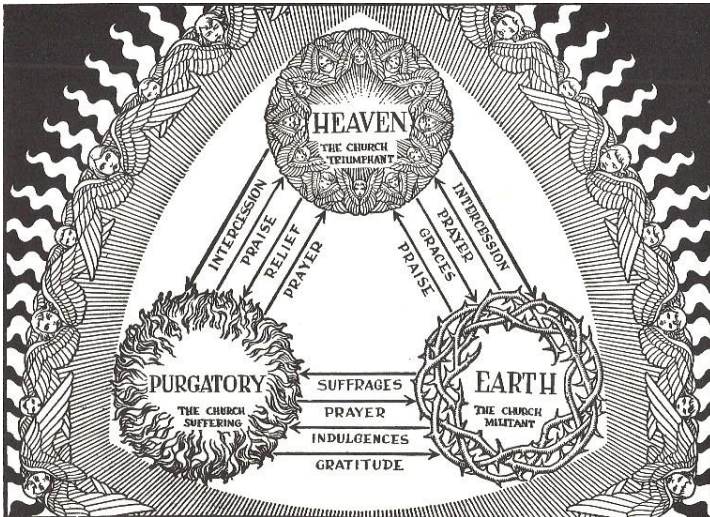

The below graphic provides a visual depiction of the relationships between the members of the Church Militant on earth, the Church Suffering in Purgatory, and the Church Triumphant in Heaven. Following up on a previous graphic on the Hours of the Divine Office featured in our March 20, 2022 column, below is a chart which explains the imagery of the various hours.

CHART OF THE OFFICE			
Hour	Time Consecrated	Keynotes	Imagery
Matins	Midnight	Quiet contemplation and peaceful anticipation	Darkness; nature at rest
Lauds	3:00 A.M.	Praise; eager anticipation	Dawn; resurrection
Prime	6:00 A.M.	Day's work; "Go into my vineyard"	Planting of seed; all occupations
Terce	9:00 A.M.	Invitation to Holy Spirit: <i>Veni</i>	Wind and fire of Pentecost
Sext	12:00 Noon	Battle for Christ's triumph; also noontide rest	Sun at zenith; Christ on cross suffering and triumphant; drawing all to himself
None	3:00 P.M.	Longing for rest from day's work; for peaceful and happy death	Lengthening shadows; harvest; "It is finished," last words of Christ
Vespers	6:00 P.M.	Thankfulness at day's end; memories of Mass, the Eucharistic thanks; Mary's thanksgiving	Mother Church at home, lighting lamps; incense of evening sacrifice; Hour of Last Supper
Compline	9:00 P.M.	Confidence in God's protection	Setting in of dark; devil as a roaring lion; but Christ's, "I will gather thee as a hen gathers her chicks"
