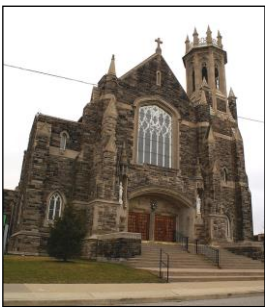

Educational Infographics for the Traditional Mass: Passiontide

The Latin Mass Society of England and Wales recently posted the below informative graphic about traditional Passiontide. In the Novus Ordo, Palm Sunday is officially known as “Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion”, combining two concepts into one. In the Traditional Latin Mass calendar, Passion Sunday is the Sunday before Palm Sunday. While a typical Lenten Sunday liturgically, Passion Sunday is the day on which churches able to do so cover their statues and sacred images with violet cloths. Traditionally-minded churches still observe this custom today, even some that do not offer the Tridentine Mass.

Beautification at Holy Name of Mary Church



Several beautification projects have recently been completed at Holy Name of Mary Church in Windsor, where the St. Benedict Tridentine Community offers the Traditional Mass on First Sundays of the month at 2:00 PM and every Tuesday at 7:00 PM.

The tabernacle has been relocated from a former Side Altar niche back to the former High Altar platform in the center of the church. A new stand has been built for the tabernacle.

The tower bells have been made functional once again and are now rung before Mass and at the Consecrations.

Spotlights for the main altar have been repaired.

An antique Holy Water font was found and restored.
