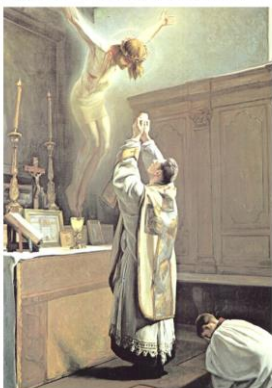
St. Benedict Choir Sings at Windsor Heritage Family of Parishes Festival Mass

Confessions and Rosary Sundays at 1:30 PM

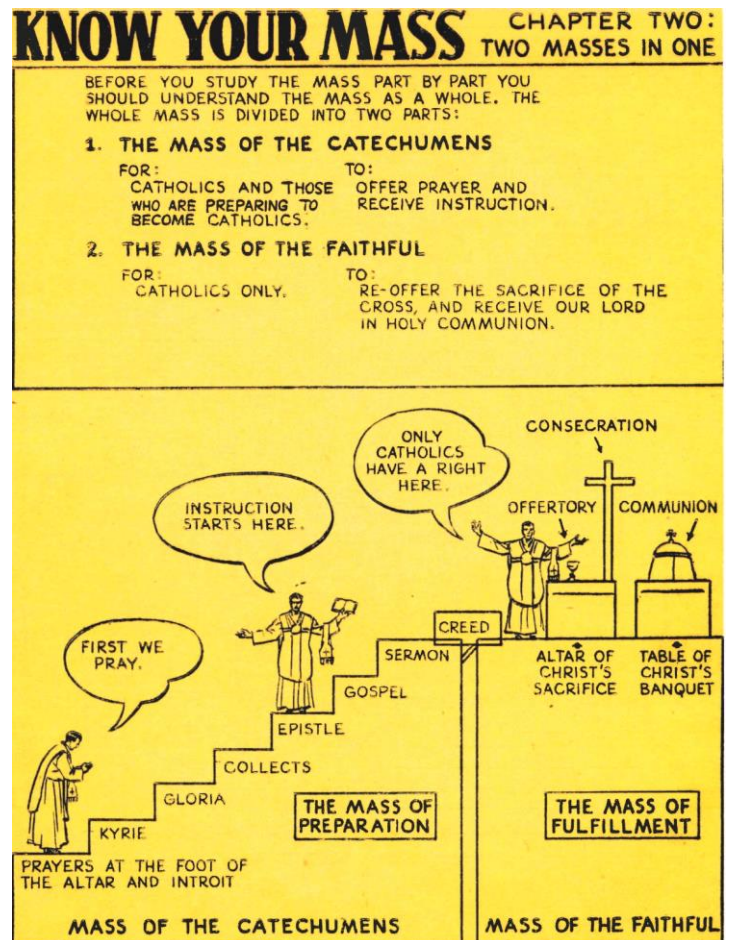
The need to provide handouts for the above event prompted a long-overdue task to be handled, the update of our local welcome brochure.

Circa 2006 this writer noticed a beautiful welcome brochure targeted towards newcomers to the Traditional Latin Mass at Holy Rosary Church in Indianapolis. In tri-fold format, this piece presents a gentle, heartfelt introduction to traditional worship. The creator of the piece granted permission for us to adapt it for use in metro Detroit, and after many years of neglect, it has finally been updated to reflect current circumstances. You can find an Oakland County Latin Mass Association version at the back of the Orchard Lake Shrine Chapel, and a St. Benedict version at the back of St. Alphonsus and Holy Name of Mary Churches in Windsor.

Educational Infographics for the Traditional Mass: The Two Parts of the Mass

The below graphic from the 1954 book, *Know Your Mass*, depicts the two parts of the Traditional Mass, the Mass of the Catechumens and the Mass of the Faithful. This corresponds to what is known in the Novus Ordo Mass as the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Historically those who were still catechumens were dismissed when the Mass of the Faithful began, hence the name. Today that might seem improper, or at least quaint, however there is no denying that only Catholics may receive the Holy Eucharist.
