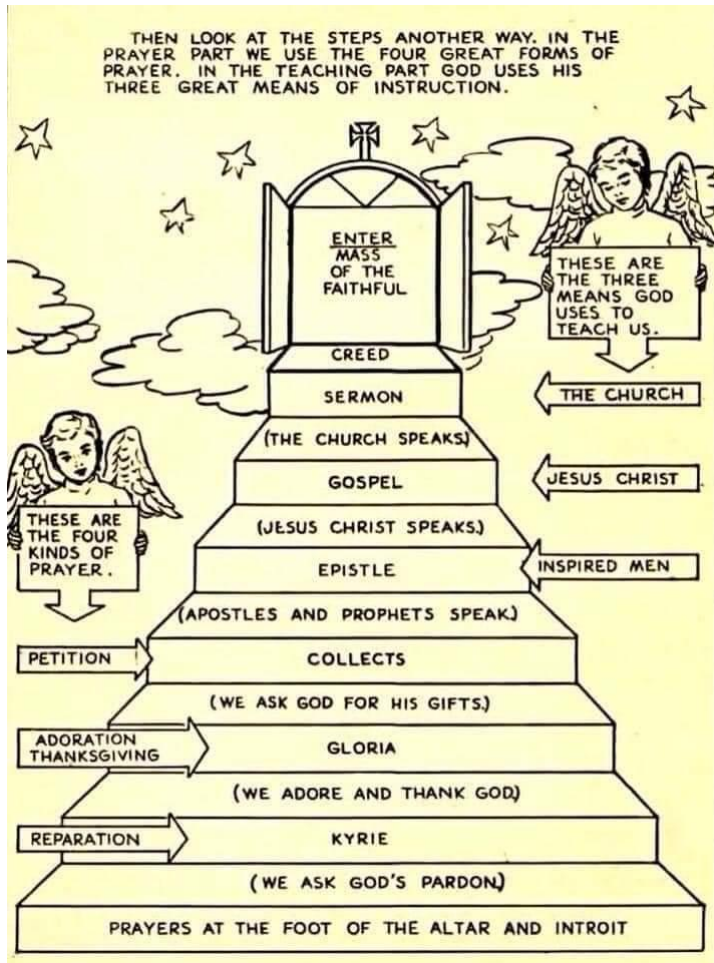

Educational Infographics for the Traditional Mass: The Mass of the Catechumens

Continuing the excerpts from the 1954 book, *Know Your Mass*, this graphic depicts the components and progression of the first half of the Traditional Mass, known as the Mass of the Catechumens. This corresponds to what is known in the Novus Ordo Mass as the Liturgy of the Word.



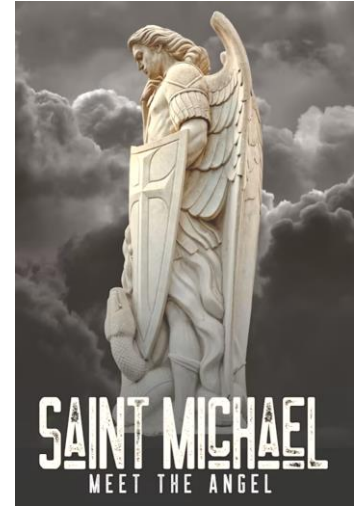
Canadian Border Restrictions Lifted

On October 1, 2022, Canada eliminated the remaining restrictions on entering the country. No longer is proof of Covid vaccination required, nor use of the ArriveCAN app. Entering Canada is once again as simple as it used to be pre-Covid. That means Americans are welcome to visit St. Benedict's Tridentine Masses at St. Alphonsus Church (2:00 PM Second through last Sundays) and Holy Name of Mary Church (2:00 PM First Sundays and 7:00 PM every Tuesday) without concerns. Be sure to bring a passport, Nexus card, or Enhanced Driver's License.

American citizens are not required to provide proof of vaccination to re-enter the United States, so crossing in both directions is essentially back to normal. The only remaining restriction is that non-U.S. citizens entering the U.S. must still provide proof of vaccination.

St. Michael the Archangel Film

The new movie *Saint Michael: Meet the Angel* debuted in a one-day showing in theatres on the Feast of the Dedication of St. Michael the Archangel, September 29. Because of higher than expected turnout, a second day in theatres has been arranged, on Thursday, October 13. Louis Madey, chaplain on that trip – to celebrate the first Tridentine Mass since Vatican II at St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, a beautiful edifice whose High Altar and sanctuary had just been restored.

Indulged Prayer for the Home

The *Manual of Indulgences* contains a prayer for the home that may sound familiar to readers of this column: It is the prayer chanted by the priest at the end of the *Aspérges Me*, the sprinkling rite held before Sunday High Mass. The Church grants a Partial Indulgence to the faithful who pray this prayer at any time:

Exáudi nos, Dómine sancte, Pater omnípotens, ætérne Deus: et mittere dignéris sanctum Ángelum tuum de cælis, qui custódiat, fóveat, prótegat, visitet atque deféndat omnes habitántes in hoc habitáculo. Per Christum Dominum nostrum. Amen.

Hear us Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God; and graciously send Your holy Angel from heaven to watch over, to cherish, to protect, to abide with, and to defend all who dwell in this house. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
