## *New Solemn Green Vestment Set for the St. Benedict Tridentine Community*



Last Sunday's Solemn High Mass at St. Alphonsus Church marked the first use of a new solemn green vestment set that Fr. Peter Hrytsyk commissioned from the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate in Toronto, using fabric by La Lame of New York City. Those of you familiar with Fr. Peter's other vestment sets made by these sisters can imagine the quality that the new set represents. These are the best-made vestment sets this writer has seen, and while not inexpensive, properly maintained, they will last a lifetime. We have long needed a solemn green set that could be loaned out to other TLM sites in our region...finally we have one.

We are also grateful that Fr. Steven Huber, C.S.B., Administrator of the Windsor Heritage Family of Parishes (Assumption, St. Alphonsus, St. Angela Merici, St. Daniel Comboni, and St. Benedict) has joined our celebrant team and served as celebrant for this Solemn High Mass.

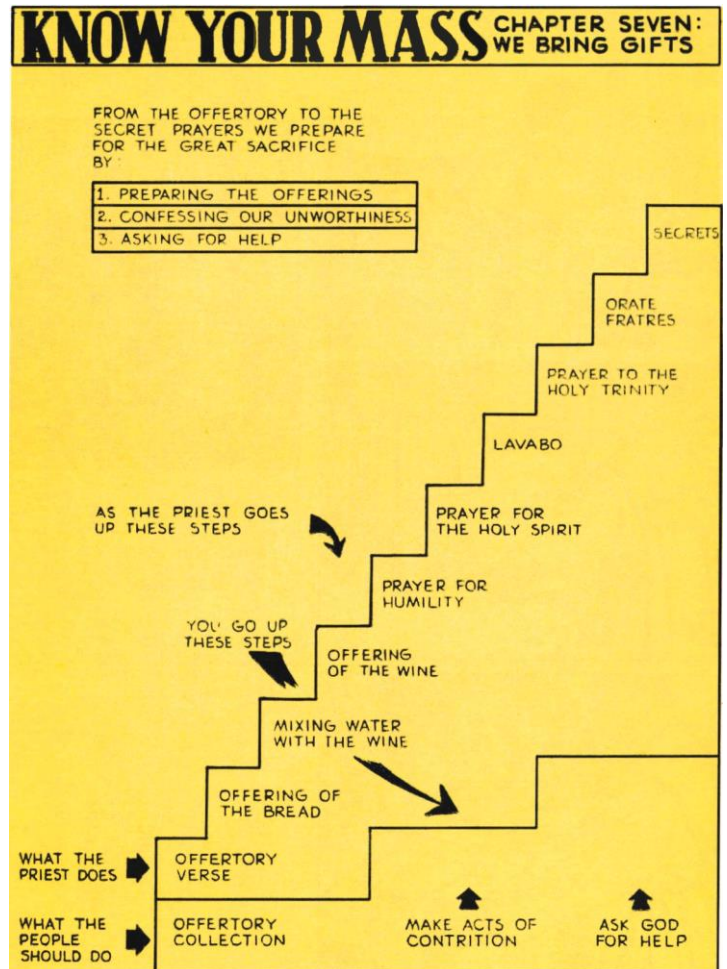

## *Educational Infographics for the Traditional Mass: The Offertory*

Continuing with our excerpts from the 1954 book, *Know Your Mass*, this graphic depicts the Offertory, the first part of the Mass of the Faithful.

Known as the Liturgy of the Eucharist in the Novus Ordo Mass, the Mass of the Faithful is the second half of the Traditional Mass. The first half of the Mass, depicted in last week's graphic, is known as the Mass of the Catechumens.
