Fr. Peter Hrytsyk's 40th Anniversary of Ordination



For months in 2006 there was а mysterious figure in a grey cassock sitting in the back of Windsor's St. Church Michael attending the Tridentine Mass. Who was this priest who was rapt in attention as he observed the rites? When then-Windsor Latin Mass Chaplain Fr. Ulysse Lefaive retired in 2007, the Diocese of London asked us to find our own chaplain, and it

became apparent that the man already sitting among us would be a logical choice. Fortunately that priest, Fr. Peter Hrytsyk, accepted the invitation. Fast forward to 2023, and many longtime TLMers in Windsor and metro Detroit have developed a great gratitude to Fr. Peter for his dedication to excellence in the celebration of the Traditional Mass, musically, rubrically, and employing exquisite vestments. For many years Fr. Peter was also a regular substitute celebrant on the Detroit side of the river, among other things having inaugurated the Christmas Midnight Tridentine Masses at St. Joseph Shrine in Detroit in 2007 and the Triduum at St. Josephat Church in 2008.

Fr. Peter is a biritual priest, having been ordained for the Ukrainian Catholic Church originally. In addition to serving as the Chaplain of the St. Benedict Tridentine Community, he is also Assistant Pastor of Ss. Vladimir & Olga Ukrainian Catholic Church in Windsor. Therefore, on this, his 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ordination to the priesthood, there will be two receptions for Fr. Peter: The first will be on Sunday, April 30 at Ss. Vladimir & Olga Church following the 10:00 AM Divine Liturgy (please RSVP to Fr. Tom Hrywna at pastor.stsvowindsor@gmail.com by Sunday, April 16 if you plan to attend).

The second reception will be on Sunday, May 21 at St. Alphonsus Church in Windsor, following the 2:00 PM Tridentine High Mass. We hope you can attend one or both and help us celebrate this holy priest who has done so much for our local Latin Mass scene.
