Now that the Easter season is upon us, it is time to pray the *Regína Cæli* in place of the *Ángelus*. During Paschaltide (Holy Saturday through the Saturday after Pentecost Sunday), one can gain a Partial Indulgence for praying the *Regína Cæli* at dawn, at noon, or in the evening.

Regína cæli, lætáre, allelúja:  
Quia quem meruisti portáre, allelúja,  
Resurréxit, sicut dixit, allelúja.  
Ora pro nobis Deum, allelúja.

☩. Gaude et lætáre, virgo María, allelúja.  
☩. Quia surréxit Dóminus vere, allelúja.

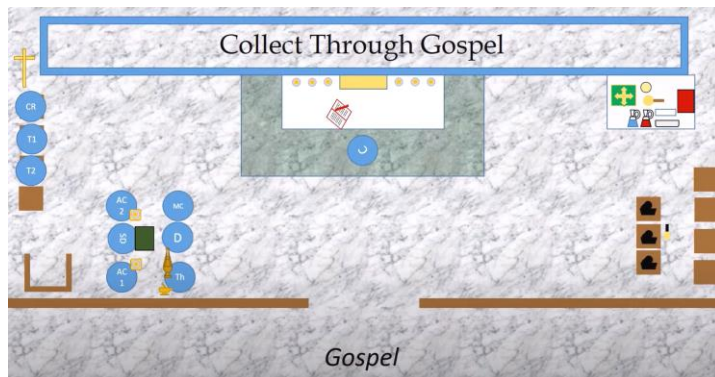

Along similar lines, the St. Philip Neri Latin Mass Chaplaincy at Burlington, Vermont's St. Anthony Church has produced a PowerPoint animation depicting the positioning and movement of the sacred ministers and altar servers at a Solemn High Mass.
