Seminarian Schola and Historic Poster Discovery at San Francisco Sacred Music Conference

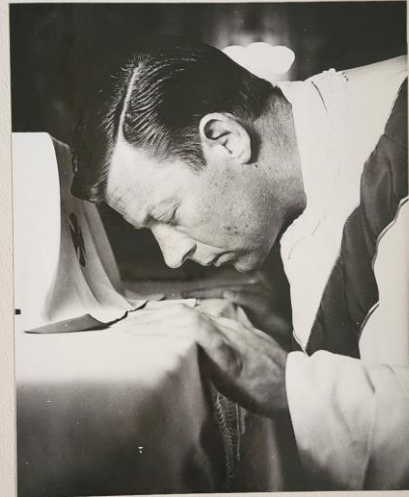
Beyond the usual array of excellent speakers, networking opportunities, and well-executed sacred liturgies we've come to expect from any sacred music conference organized by Dr. Jennifer Donelson-Nowicka, last week's conference at St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, California celebrating the life and work of Gregorian Chant pioneer Dr. William Mahrt contained two noteworthy developments: First, San Francisco Archdiocesan Archivist Dr. Jacek Nowicki (Jenny's husband) discovered an historic set of posters buried in some old boxes at the seminary, most likely intended to explain the Mass to adults (the handwritten explanations at the bottom of some of the posters use words that would not be familiar to children). A little sleuthing revealed that these photos were taken at St. Francisco's St. Ignatius (Jesuit) Church, likely in the early 1960s. Jacek hopes to have them scanned in for use as educational guides at Extraordinary Form communities in the region.
