Speaking of the Napa Institute, marketing e-mails are being sent out about their

annual summer conference held, fittingly, in Napa Valley, California, at one of Tim Busch's hotels, the Meritage Resort, July 23-27, 2025.

In an e-mail blast sent out on May 29 to promote the conference, Tim stated, "Liturgy was one area where I really thought we would be able to do better than other conferences. The Meritage has a newly renovated chapel, Our Lady of Grapes, where Masses are celebrated every hour throughout the conference. Besides the English Mass, we will have Mass in Latin, both Novus Ordo and Tridentine, as well as Eastern liturgy."

This is a noteworthy item to mention, because the Napa Institute Conference is not primarily a liturgically-oriented gathering. It seems more oriented to those from a conservative Novus Ordo background seeking to learn more about their faith and about the Church in general. Nevertheless, for years the conference has offered the TLM as an option for their attendees.
