## *Canticle Chant Camp Report*

Approximately 60 children and young adults participated in the Chant Camp offered by Gregorian Chant instruction organization Canticle at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Ann Arbor Monday – Friday, July 28 – August 1. The session was led by San Diego-based Canticle founder Mary Ann Carr Wilson and her son Tad.

About 70 faithful attended a 6:00 PM Mass on Friday, August 1, at which the students sang Gregorian Mass IV plus hymns and motets. Following the Mass a reception was held.

Mary Ann and Tad toured downtown Detroit and several of our historic churches on Saturday, July 26, and Greenfield Village and the Ford Rouge Plant [photo adjacent] on Saturday, August 2. They also sang with the St. Benedict Tridentine Community Choir in Windsor at the 2:00 PM Masses on July 27 and August 3.

Plans are being made to have Canticle back in the region to hold another Chant Camp at St. Thomas the Apostle, and possibly one in the Archdiocese of Detroit in the summer of 2026. More information and registration details will be provided in this column when dates are set.



## *Pilgrimage to Clear Creek*

News from the Saginaw Latin Mass Community:

### ***The Three Hearts Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Clear Creek Abbey in Oklahoma!***

Join members of the Holy Family Parish in Saginaw as they go on the Three Hearts Pilgrimage this upcoming October 9th-11th. They will depart from the Church of the Holy Family in Saginaw early in the morning of October 8th, and will return to the same location late on October 12th (Arrangements can be made to meet up around Ann Arbor and join the pilgrim caravan from there, but in doing so you'll miss the Blessing of Pilgrims upon their departure!). Through the trip to Oklahoma and on the Pilgrimage itself, pilgrims will experience Mass in the Traditional Roman Rite (TLM), pray the Rosary in both Latin and the vernacular, have opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, sing hymns & folk songs, join the chapter in group morning and night prayers, and so much more (not to mention a visit to the gorgeous St. Francis de Sales Oratory in St. Louis)! Anyone from Archdiocese of Detroit & the Diocese of Lansing is welcome to join their chapter, which is dedicated under the patronage of the Holy Family. The cost of pilgrimage registration is \$81.25, and costs for transportation vary year to year due to gas prices, but \$150 is a good estimate (bringing the whole total to around \$230).
